One more application is needed in order to reinstate the Commission. Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie stated that Mr. Kelly Benson has been made aware the application has been received.

Capital Planning Water System

Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie requested that this on the agenda but she is not requesting any action at this time.

-NEW BUSINESS-

1. 538 Red Toad Road, North East Maryland – Water Allocation Request – 250 GPD

Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie recommends that the water allocation of 250 gallons per day be approved as presented. A motion to approve the water allocation request of 250 gallons per day for 538 Red Toad road was made by Commissioner Kline, seconded by Commissioner Stark and approved by all.

2. 382 Red Toad Road, North East Maryland – Water Allocation Request – 250 GPD

Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie recommends that the water allocation of 250 gallons per day be approved as presented. A motion to approve the water allocation request of 250 gallons per day for 382 Red Toad Road was made by Commissioner Braley, seconded by Commissioner Crothers-Moore and approved by all.

3. Agreement – Ridgely Forest Water Line Fee

Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie stated that pursuant to a recorded Agreement there is an outstanding fee of \$215,435.35 due the Town for a water line that the previous developer was to pay. The Agreement is assignable and goes with the land. The original term had the fee due upon receipt. Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie reported that staff and the legal team discussed the new owners draw and takedown schedule of lots and recommend the following revision to the term of the agreement. They propose the \$215,435.35 fee is due and payable (1) one year from the date of execution of the agreement and (2) the fee is paid in quarterly payments of no less than \$50,000.00 per quarter. A motion to approve the revision to the agreement as outlined was made by Commissioner Stark, seconded by Commissioner Crothers-Moore and approve by all.

In response to a request from Mayor McKnight, Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie proved the following status of the Ridgely Forest development:

- Project was started by Clark-Turner Homes
- Town called in the Bonds November 20, 2015 because the road, water line, sidewalk and landscape work was not complete pursuant to the Public Works Agreements. Approximately ³/₄ Million Dollars of work was performed in the Fall of 2017.
- December 2015 the Town was notified that Mr. Turner filed Chapter 7 Bankruptcy on November 25, 2015
- Town has been working with the Bank and the Bonding Company,
- There are some smaller items that need to be addressed, but we are well on the way to getting them complete
- What is supposed to happen is after a 1 year warranty period, the improvements will be dedicated to the Town
- We have been meeting with the contract purchasers so that when they take ownership, they can hit the ground running
- It is a Master Plan Community with several phases and many steps
- They have brought to us the desire to make phasing changes as well as add lots where they can
- The bank has presented the Town with a deed for processing. Once the bank acquires the property they will turn around and sell it to the new Developers
- What is essential is knowing what actions are needed and in what order they come

-MISCELLANEOUS-

Employee Appreciation Dinner

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Mrs. Cook-MacKenzie reminded the Board that the Employee Appreciation dinner will be on January 13, 2018. Staff will obtain options from local caterers for the Board to review at the next Town Board meeting.

A motion to approve Requisition R8-737 to Lecco Pine Line Construction in the amount of \$27,290.00 for various water main and service line repairs was made by Commissioner Kline, seconded by Commissioner Braley and approved by all.

A motion to approve the invoices presented for payment was made by Commissioner Stark, seconded by Commissioner Braley and approved by all.

-BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR-

Judith E. Cole of 741 England Creamery Road, North East, Maryland 21901 and 436 Cara Cove Road, North East, Maryland 21901 expressed disapproval of a proposed distribution center at Nazarene Camp Road. Her concerns are dangerous traffic and vehicles not using alternate merge properly. Mrs. Cole called Cecil County and was told to bring her concerns to Town of North East since the property is under the Town's planning jurisdiction.

With there being no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Braley, seconded by Commissioner Stark and approved by all. The meeting adjourned at 7:31 p.m.
